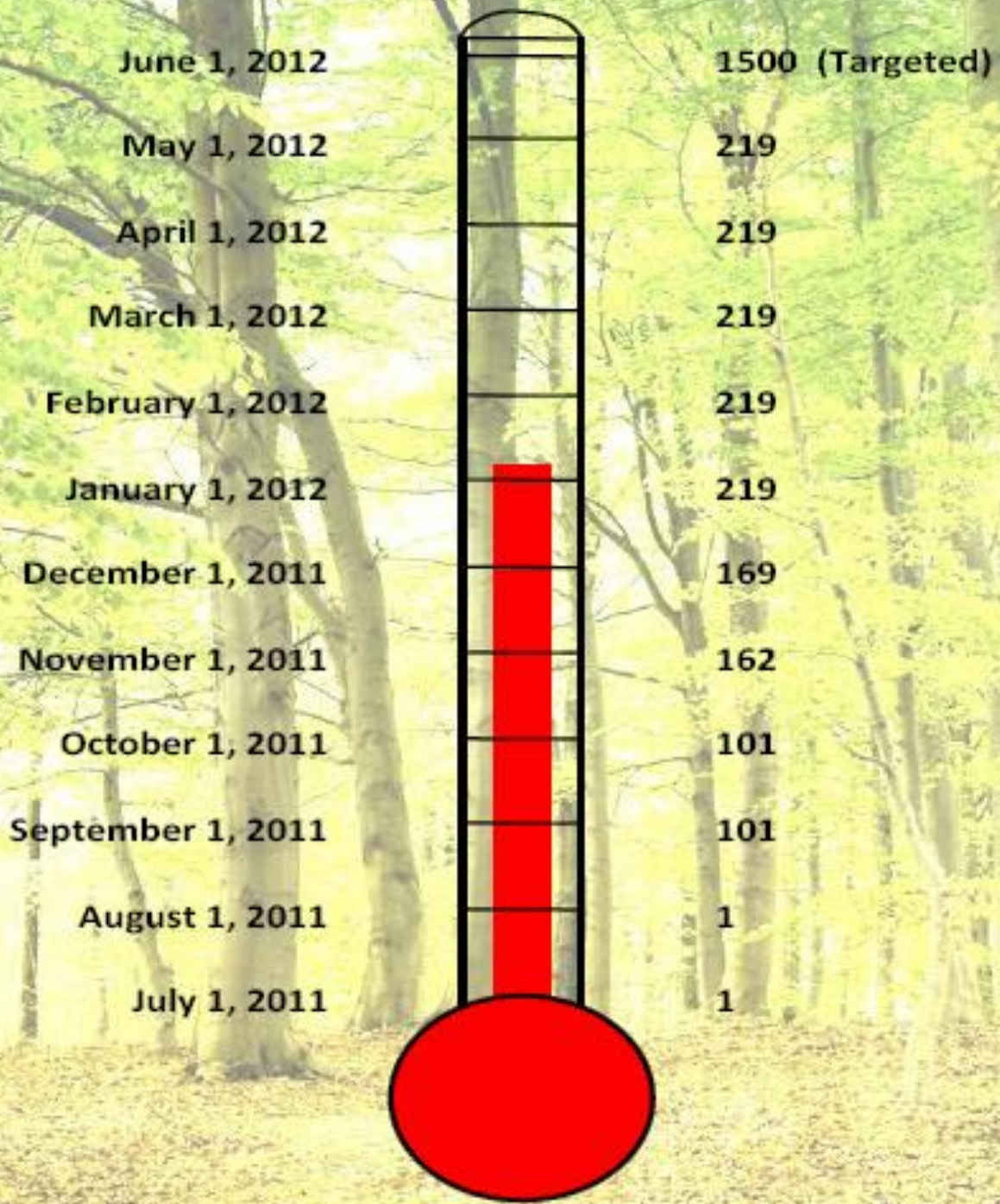

Last year's Relieving the Hunger campaign helped feed more than seven million people. Can we help even more this year? The campaign continues through January 31, 2012, so there is still time for your club or district to plan additional activities.

First of all, in this season of belief, let me offer best wishes to all my fellow Lions, their loved ones, friends and families. We have come a long way in five months. My belief in the power of what every Lion can do to change the world is as strong as ever.



The early success of our campaign to plant 1 million trees makes me both proud and so humble. Whether it's planting trees in lands scarred by the tsunami in Japan or tornadoes in the United States, or planting trees to restore our planet's critical forests in Africa or South Asia, we have succeeded in unifying Lions all over the world. These acts of service are fun and rewarding to do. They bring clubs together and bring smiles to ourselves and to people in the communities we serve. Through mid-November, together we planted more than 5.7 MILLION trees in more than 60 countries. Isn't that amazing?

Some Lions ask me if I will set another target. I politely say "no" because I believe the target lies in each of our hearts. It is the Lions who determine how far we go and how many trees we plant. Every tree counts, even if you can plant only one. Every member matters, too.

We have strong membership growth this year, exceeding a 16,000 net gain through mid-November. Lions Quest is Helping Military Families Achieve Wellness

Deployed soldiers face daunting challenges daily. So do their children back home. Research shows that children with a deployed parent consistently demonstrate higher levels of emotional difficulties and symptoms of anxiety that don't abate after the deployed parent returns. School-aged children often show decline in academic performance and increase in depression and behavioral problems in response to the emotional stress. Nearly two million military children have been affected by deployments to Iraq and Afghanistan.

The U.S. Army's Child, Adolescent & Family Behavioral Health Office (CAF-BHO) is piloting a school-based behavioral health program at Joint Base Lewis-McChord that utilizes evidenced-based curriculum such as Lions Quest. Lions Quest was recently designated as a ["Promising" program by Penn State's Clearinghouse for Military Family Readiness](#), which is funded by the Department of Defense and the U.S. Department of Agriculture. Lions Clubs International Foundation is honored to help military families achieve readiness, resiliency and wellness through Lions Quest.

New LCIF Community Partnership Grant

LCIF is now offering **Community Partnership Grants** to bring Lions Quest to a new community, or to reactivate dormant programs. Grants are non-matching, available for up to US\$10,000 and awarded on a rolling basis to allow Lions to capitalize on interest in Lions Quest when and where it exists. Grant funds may be used to host teacher training workshops, promote Lions Quest, and establish partnerships with school districts, community organizations, and government agencies. 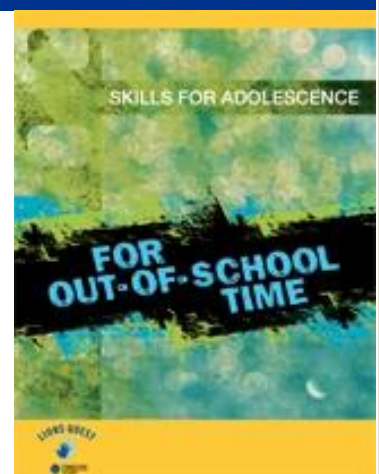
New Skills for Adolescence for Out-of-School Time Program

The SFA for OST manual includes:

- Relationship-centered learning community strategies and activities
- Implementation tools

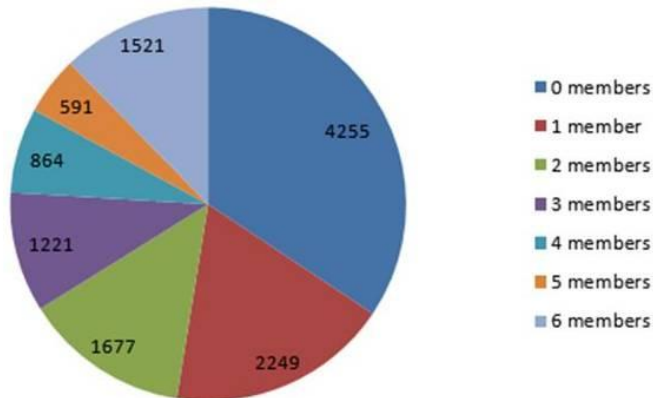

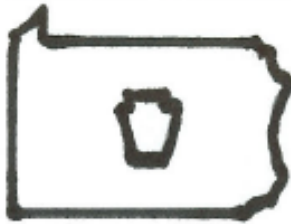
