Lions, Lioness, and LEOs:

This is my last input for the newsletter as VDG. But it is just the beginning of the real fun. I prepared this prior to the State Convention in order to meet the newsletter input timing but I am sure I had a good time and learned a lot.

Presidents and secretaries: Please be sure to share this letter with your replacements. There is very important information for them to read and understand. Thanks.

By now the **new directory** is in the printer's hands for preparation. If you are very very quick, there may be time to get me the information that was due last month. That would be any missing PU-101s with the new officer names. We don't want the past officers listed do we? That would mean that you get the mail and the questions. Also I believe all clubs have been contacted for scheduling the D.G.'s visitation. If the incoming president or secretary has not responded, I will be going with the stated date. If not contacted, please let me know quickly that I missed you.

With 50 of the 55 Lions Clubs M&As available through May 11th, we now show a total Lions membership of 1881. The May reports available show a gain of six and a loss of nineteen (six losses were due to death). With nine of the ten Lioness Clubs reporting, they are at 292; a gain of one. Is your M&A in? There are a few days-hours left to induct new members this year.

If you are in **Zone 2B, 4A or 4C**, please recognize the responsibility that must be taken by a Lion in those Zones to fill the position of Zone Chairman. There is no question that these zones have members with the credentials for the position. The only thing it takes is a call or email to me to discuss the opportunity to serve your club in a wider range. We, your clubs, need you. Please share this with all members. Remember that now that you are about to a past president, you are eligible to be a zone chairperson.

Unfortunately the search for a Vice District Governor candidate for 2005-06 continues. It is not too late to step up. If you have an interest or have questions on qualifications, please feel free to contact PDG Voni Grimes at 751-2736 or myself at the numbers listed below. This is a must on the to-do list.

All clubs have worked hard this year to raise funds. In order to have them recorded in your year, please be sure to send all funds to or notify the District Treasurer of your donations. These must be in as soon as possible; like now.

We still have a few clubs that are behind on reporting their M&As. In some cases it has become apparent that there is a level of confusion on the need to report to both International and the District. Currently it is required to do both. The LCI folks do not see our site and therefore need to get your report directly. On the other hand, if you only report to LCI we get no details of your activity. If you send it in by paper to LCI, we see it weeks later. We anticipate some significant improvement on this process this next year but until then we need your inputs of the M&A at both levels. Please be sure to get them in to both LCI and the District. Thanks for your help.

As before for reporting, click on District Reporting on the left and go from there. The password will be the same generic one for your first entry but then you will be directed to enter a new one that will be your individual password.

You will also find that the other parts of the front page are now alive and have information in it. The June newsletter will be posted and the letter will be posted there each month hereafter. If you have an email address, you will no longer receive the newsletter by email or by paper beginning August 1st. You will receive an email notice that the letter has been posted and a link will be included.

Yes, even a live person will exist at the other end of the Webmaster's connection. Constructive comments are appreciated. Please be kind and allow us the time to clear any unknown bugs and to add features as we grow.

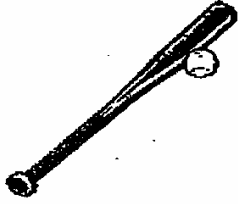
