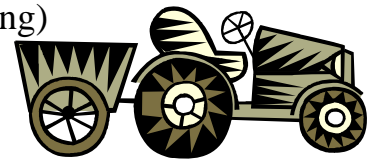

OFFICIAL MINUTES OF THE APRIL 16TH, 2011
CABINET MEETING HELD AT THE YORKTOWNE HOTEL, YORK, PA

DG Dennis Bell called the meeting to order at 2:50 P.M. with singing of one verse of America, Pledge to the Flag, and the Invocation by Lion Rev. Ed Miller.

There were 100 in attendance: 75 Lions, 6 Lioness, 12 PDGs, 2 PCCs, 2 PIDs, and 5 guests.

DG Dennis established protocol at this time.

DG Dennis remarked that it's been a wonderful time and he has enjoyed every minute. He reminded everyone to continue to work on membership and to keep having fun. All M&As are on time.

DG Dennis asked for a motion to accept the Minutes of the February Cabinet Meeting which were printed in the April Newsletter. ZC Noah made a motion to accept the minutes and Zone Chair Jim Boswell seconded. Motion carried.

DG Dennis asked for a motion to amend the minutes of the February Cabinet meeting where the nominations were mistakenly closed. This motion is to amend the February Cabinet meeting minutes to indicate that the nominations were inadvertently closed and that they remain open. ZC Ed Gillman made the motion to amend the minutes, ZC Jim Boswell seconded. Motion carried.

At this time PDG Dean Smeltzer gave the treasurer's report. Zone Chair Ed Gilliam made a motion to accept the report as read and Zone Chair Peck Freeland seconded. Motion carried.

DG Dennis stated that he still has District Pins for sale if anyone would like them. They are 2 pins for five dollars.

DG Dennis reported on where we are on membership. We started the year off losing two clubs making it -27 members before the year got off the ground. Right now we are -36. We still have time to improve membership. Ardentsville got 5 new members, Camp Hill 3, Cashtown 6, Jacobus 5, and Shippensburg 6. Several clubs had 1 or 2 new members. Plainfield had 7 new members.

VDG Shirley asked the clubs need to get their PU 101's in to her so they can get that information in the directory.

PDG Gordon Sinclair called for a motion to close the nominations for District Governor, ZC Noah Krout made a motion to close the nominations, ZC Ed Gillman seconded. Motion carried.

VDG Shirley held her remarks for the caucus.

PDG Gordon asked for a motion to close the nominations for 1st VDG. ZC Jim Boswell made a motion to close the nominations, IPDG George seconded. Motion carried.

ZC Noah also held his remarks for the caucus.

The nomination for 2nd VDG is automatically closed because there is no candidate at this time.

DG Dennis introduced Lion Lani Kahawaii for her remarks. Her message to the district focused on service. No matter how large or small your club or district is, you can make a difference.

DG Dennis introduced PID Maurice Kahawaii for his remarks. PID Maurice who is the area advisor for GMT (Global Membership Team) gave a presentation on what GMT is and how it will work.

DG Dennis introduced PID Wayne Davis for his remarks. PID Wayne who is area GLT (Global Leadership Team) advisor for West Virginia, Ohio, Virginia and Pennsylvania expressed his appreciation for the time spent with the Lions of District 14-C. PID Wayne explained what the GLT is and stated that he is looking forward to working on the GLT with the Lions in his area.

DG Dennis and PID Maurice presented Certificates of Appreciation to:
ZC Ed Gillman; ZC Gene Burk; ZC Lamar Freeland; Lion Ortrun Gates; and Lion Dan McGary.

Lion Linda Oneto presented a report on Family and Membership Development. She talked on the different membership opportunities we have: a son, a daughter, a friend, a co-worker, and family membership.

PDG Gordon Reported on LCIF. He said he had 4 things: 1- He collected \$133.00 in the basket raffle and he will be giving away 3 items; (2) He set a goal of \$2,500.00 for this year which he reached the other night and is looking to reach \$3,000.00; (3) Anyone sending donations for Japan can receive a MJF up until June 30th ; and (4) If you are sending donations to LCIF, the address has changed on where to send your donations. He will have the new address put in the May Newsletter.

Under New Business

DG Dennis reported for Lion Ray Rosnick on Hearing Research. Lions Night with the Senators will be June 30th.

DG Dennis and Sandy presented appreciation gifts to PID Maurice and Lion Lani.

Under Old Business

DG Dennis reported for Lion Bill Bishop, Eyeglass Chairperson. Anyone with used eyeglasses let him know where they are so he can gather them. The district has reached almost 15,000 pair.

DG Dennis thanked the Convention Committee for all their work and patience putting together the convention.

DG Dennis reported on up coming events: MD State Convention, May19-22nd Cranberry Township, PA; 2011 International Convention, July 4-8 Seattle, Washington.

PDG Larry Shaull gave a quick report on the Golf Ball Drop held on Friday, April 15. They made \$6,000.00 and the Shiloh Lioness won the ball drop and received \$5,000.00.

DG Dennis at the caucus explained the voting process and contents of the ballot: for District Governor Shirley Starner; for Vice District Governor Noah Krout. The resolution on the ballot for approval is to have the 2nd Vice District Governor reimbursed for his/her expenses.

PDG Al Hayes gave the results of the election: There were 43 delegates, two clubs did not bring there credentials. The results were: for District Governor – Shirley Starner, for 1st VDG Noah Krout, for 2nd VDG there was no candidate, and the resolution to help with the expenses for the 2nd VDG passed.

VDG Shirley thanked all the Lions for their confidence in her, and stated that she is proud to be Governor for District 14-C for the year 2011/2012. Her goals for the year are to have an increase in membership and plan activities that meet the needs of all. There will be an Octoberfest, a district Walk for Diabetes, a Holiday Party in December, and a Rally in April to recognize all club presidents.

ZC Noah Krout thanked everyone for their support and is looking forward to working with Shirley in the coming Lions year. The year will be a learning experience for him.

PDG Gordon held the basket raffle for LCIF funds. He gave away three baskets. He also held the 50/50 raffle. There were 3- \$20.00 winners, 3- \$10.00 winners, and 2-\$5.00 winners.

PDG Larry Bare held the district basket raffle. There were 13 baskets raffled off which raised \$511.00.

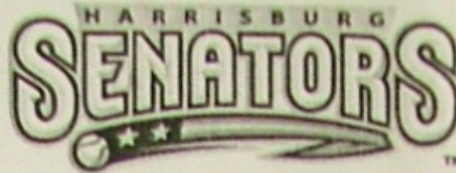
Lion Rev. Ed Miller gave the Benediction.

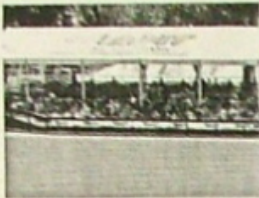

Third Annual Kid's Sight

ForSight Vision will be hosting its third annual Kids' Sight on July 30 and 31, 2011 at our agency. In collaboration with VSP, we have a mobile vision van that has two optometric lanes for examinations. We also will have at least one, if not two, more lanes in our building. We recruit volunteer optometrists for this program. Usually, WellsSpan sends their Health Connect Van, and last year, they provided free flu shots. In 2009, we provided 87 free exams and 64 free pairs of glasses. Last year we provided 57 free exams and 46 pairs of free glasses. Although designed to serve children, we do fill out our schedule with adults as space and time permit. Our only criteria for service is that the individual have a Social Security card, not be seen by an eye care professional in a year and have family income at or below 200% of the federal poverty guidelines. As this will be early in your year as Dg and Noah's as VDG, this could be a nice opportunity to get out of the gate with a bang. It would be great if you could promote this event and get our Lions and Lioness Clubs to refer patients. If you are interested in supporting us, perhaps you might like to stop and tour our agency and discuss this further.
